# 2021 - Celebrating 30 Years of Success!

## THE NEW POWER GRANT

Recognizing that each member has different needs, this new grant program is customizable and provides members with the power to choose how their grant funds will be used. In addition to safety items, the Power Grant can be used for a wide range of other initiatives such as implementing risk control best practices, repairing or replacing playground surfacing and equipment, COVID-19 related expenses, employment and HR training, cyber awareness and security training, Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI) certification, First Aid, Lifeguard, CPR and AED training and Certified Pool and Spa Inspector training, to name a few.

## BACK-TO-BACK COVID RELIEF

For the second year, IPARKS issued back to each member agency a portion of its contribution as part of its COVID relief program. IPARKS understood that the pandemic was still impacting programs and services that generate revenue and we wanted to help ease that burden.

## JUST-IN-TIME SEASONAL CONTENT, DELIVERED RIGHT TO YOUR INBOX

As the seasons change, so do the programs and services offered by members. IPARKS launched a new risk management program and sent monthly content to our members in order to stay ahead of potential risks. IPARKS also provided members with resources to assist in navigating the continuing pandemic to ensure

the safest ways for community members to enjoy member facilities. The just-in-time seasonal content included topics such as landscaping safety, aquatic best practices, return to work webinars, synthetic turf best practices, dog park safety best practices, hayrides best practices and ice-skating checklists, to name a few.

## EXEMPLARY MEMBER PROGRAM

IPARKS celebrates members who continue to contribute to the success of our program. To show our appreciation, the Exemplary Member Program was extended to provide a 10% rate reduction for three years to members who achieved a qualifying favorable loss ratio. Since this program was introduced in 2018, IPARKS has recognized nearly 92% of the membership, a testament to our members' commitment to the safety of Illinois parks, recreation areas, forest preserves and conservancies in their communities.

## ENHANCED COVERAGES

In addition to the programs and resources above, a few coverage enhancements were added at no additional cost to the membership. All members' property coverage was expanded to include coverage for Unscheduled Property in the Open with a \$100,000 aggregate limit, which includes fences, flagpoles, traffic control devices, sirens, gates, radio or television antennas, traffic or road signs, docks, free-standing lights, light poles and streetlights. And, at the close of 2021, IPARKS

approved the launch of the Electronic Vandalism Endorsement for 2022, which provides a limit of \$250,000 per occurrence, an increase from the previous Computer Virus Extension limit.

## STRONG FINANCIAL POSITION

As you will see in the following pages of this report, IPARKS had another strong year financially and closed out 2021 with a net position of \$19,877,305, up from \$19,138,130 in 2020. We have you, our members, to thank for IPARKS' continued success.

As we celebrate the past 30 years and embrace the next 30, IPARKS will continue to deliver on its promise to provide customized coverage, valuable resources and programs and outstanding service to its members. We look forward to serving you, as together, we continue to make IPARKS the premier risk sharing pool in Illinois.

# MEMBER BENEFITS



## IPARKS POWER GRANT

You asked, and we delivered! IPARKS received many requests for the grant program to include a broader category of items. It is now called the IPARKS Power Grant and has expanded areas of reimbursement eligibility. The new Power Grant is customizable and provides each member the power to choose how to use grant funds from a newly expanded list. Each entity is eligible for either **\$500**, **\$1,000**, or **\$1,500** in Power Grant funds dependent on contribution amount. In addition to safety items, the Power Grant has been expanded and can now be used for any of the items below.

**Training and Education:** Expenses incurred in providing training to prevent or reduce liability claims or property losses. Examples include:

- Employment and HR training
- Cyber awareness and security training
- Certified Playground Safety Inspector (CPSI) certification
- First Aid, Lifeguard, CPR and AED training
- Certified Pool and Spa Inspector training

**Playground Safety:** Expenses incurred in repairing or replacing playground surfacing or equipment that is outdated, broken, or in need of upgrading or repair. Examples include:

- Rock climbing walls/handles
- Swings
- Slides
- Monkey bars
- Playground safety signage
- Playground surfacing materials

**Risk Control:** Expenses incurred in implementing risk control best practices. Examples include:

- Grounds and roads inspections and safety best practices
- Prepping parks for summer or winter activities
- Tree inspection and trimming
- Sidewalk and trail inspections
- Pool safety
- COVID-19 related expenses



## SWING MODIFICATION

The Swing Modification Program provides members with assistance in upgrading swing sets to conform to national playground safety standards. Members are eligible to receive up to **\$350** in reimbursement annually for approved swing set replacement parts from a playground equipment manufacturer.



## AQUATICS GRANT

The Aquatics Reimbursement Program promotes pool operation education and training. Under this program, IPARKS reimburses members up to **\$500** annually for training and auditing services provided by the following approved aquatic training vendors: Jeff Ellis and Associates, Starfish Aquatics Institute and American Red Cross.

## MESSAGE FROM JASON JOHNSTON

The pandemic continued to be a hot topic in 2021. While some programs were able to restart after taking a hiatus in 2020, the pandemic continued to cancel numerous programs and events. However, many IPARKS members utilized the IPARKS COVID-19 waivers for facility usage agreements and participant waivers to help protect against liability for programs and events that were held in 2021. In addition, IPARKS members were able to utilize the IPARKS Power Grant for purchasing COVID-19 related supplies, such as cleaning materials and sanitizers, to provide safe environments for their employees and community members. With hopes of putting the worst of the pandemic behind them, IPARKS members will be looking forward to bringing back past programs and events. The IPARKS eLibrary offers best practices and checklists for new and returning programs and events, with topics such as special events, firework displays, mobile food truck fire safety, vendor contracts, and serving alcohol at events.

Another trending topic is cyber security. The IPARKS eLibrary also offers best practices and checklists for IT related functions, such as: building security, business continuity and disaster recovery, purchasing and audits, and new hire transfers and terminations. In addition, the eLibrary also offers a wide range of IT resources through the Cyber Portal.

With pool operations likely to fully return, lifeguarding will also be a trending topic for 2022. Members will continue to work hard to attract and train employees during a lifeguard shortage. To assist with attracting lifeguards, members have a \$500 lifeguard certification training reimbursement grant available.



# MEMBER SERVICES



## RESOURCE ELIBRARY

IPARKS members have access to hundreds of helpful resources in a variety of convenient formats through the eLibrary. The eLibrary is an online resource library that provides access to useful tools and training materials such as documents, presentations, human resources materials, webinars, Public Entity University courses, online training, and streaming videos. IPARKS members can learn how to best use the Resource eLibrary by requesting a virtual tutorial from Hillary Waddle.



Early in 2021, IPARKS sent out a survey regarding the Resource eLibrary. We are grateful to the many members who took the time to respond to the survey, providing their thoughts on how we can make the eLibrary even better. As a result of that input, we redesigned the eLibrary, implementing member suggestions. The eLibrary now has an updated look and new features including a dashboard that shows members what's trending in the resource world. A dropdown search function was added so users can search by resource and subject matter common to all members such as cybersecurity, employment practices, and emergency services. In addition, the "What's New?" section allows us to continuously update the home page with cybersecurity and employment practices that were recently added, to keep members informed of trending risk control matters. While we gave the Resource eLibrary a new look and feel and enhanced functionality, we also added a number of new resources to the eLibrary in 2021.



Given the increased focus on cyber issues, the risk control team created 25 sets of cyber best practices and checklists that are now included in the Documents section of the eLibrary. In addition, best practices and checklists were also added on topics such as golf courses, vehicle storage, splash pads, dog parks, hayrides, haunted houses, parades and situational awareness.

We also added a number of courses to Public Entity University, a vendor-driven portal that provides comprehensive training on the topics faced by our members. In 2021, the focus was on driving safety.

### CYBER PORTAL

Through the Resource eLibrary, IPARKS members have access to a Cyber Portal. The Cyber Portal provides members with a short cyber assessment that can highlight and then provide solutions via policies, for any cyber security deficiencies. In addition, IPARKS members can access:

- Customizable Cybersecurity Incident Response Plans
- An IT Security Audit Kit that provides sample policy templates and operating procedures for HR, IT and Operations departments
- Cyber best practices and checklists
- Essential webinars on topics such as Emerging Cyber Security Threats and Network Security.

The Cyber Portal also provides members with online cyber trainings and essential webinars, including the following titles:
